Swimmers are seldom injured and group assistance, while helpful, is seldom needed." #### **BOYS' CAMP SUPPLY LIST**

### **Necessary Items**

- 1. Sleeping bag or blankets, etc.
- 2. Tent (Let us know in advance if you don't have a tent and we can work something out for a loaner or sharing. There is also an indoor dining area at the property we are using this year and that could be used for sleeping if necessary. Tent camping is preferable.)
- 3. Towels/wash cloth
- 4. Toiletries
  - a. shampoo and soap
  - b. toothpaste and toothbrush
  - c. deodorant
- 5. **Baseball cap** (or similar) Used for capture the flag.
- 6. Sun screen especially for canoeing and swimming
- 7. <u>Canteen</u> or water bottle *WITH NAME ON IT. IMPORTANT FOR CANOE TRIP AND OUTINGS*.
- 8. Swim trunks
- 9. Pants and shirt (without logos) for Mass (N.B.— They do not need to be dressed up for Mass but they do need pants and a shirt without logos for Mass. Make sure they have at least one change of clothes that meets these requirements! No shorts at Mass.)
- 10. Warm clothes for the evening in case weather turns cooler.
- 11. Rosary (we will be praying the rosary every day)
- 12. An extra pair of shoes for the river trip or walking in the creek. Water shoes would be fine but sandals are not recommended as they need to be something that will stay on the foot in river currents or when walking in the river. This is a very important item as walking barefoot in the river is a safety hazard especially when trying to get a swamped canoe to shore. It's also important that this be an extra pair of shoes and not the shoes you'll be wearing the rest of the day. Walking around in soaking wet shoes is no fun!

# **Optional Items**

- 1. Bicycle. There is no bike ride this year due to logistics in transportation. So no real need for one.
- 2. Flashlight (Not required, but it's a really bright idea.)
- 3. Pillow
- 4. Insect repellant (It's always a good idea to have some repellant, but the mosquitoes prefer that you don't bring it.)
- 5. Camera/film (Does anybody use film anymore?)
- 6. Missal for attending Mass. This is strongly recommended although there are various good ways to attend Mass besides using a missal and I realize there may be some concern about damaging the missal in the camp environment.
- 7. Lifejacket if you have your own you prefer to use. We have plenty for everyone.

# **Do Not Bring**

Video games of any kind, CD Players/Radios/MP3's, etc. (These and similar items will be confiscated and possibly destroyed. **Don't bring them to camp.** Also telegraphs, phonographs, cassette players, 8 track, satellite dishes, etc. Homing pigeons are permitted though.)

For the good of all campers <u>cell phones/smart phones</u> are not permitted at camp. Their use distracts from camp and it is not possible to supervise. Camp staff and volunteers will have phones which the boys can use to contact their parents if necessary. If you have special reasons for wanting your son to bring a cell phone, <u>please make arrangements with Fr. Gabriel before camp. Father can be reached at 617-702-2207 before and during camp.</u> If you have not notified us that they have one, it will be confiscated. If it is visible or heard, it is subject to inspection in order to enforce these rules and for the good of other campers.
